Formative assessments = monitor student learning, they are assessments which can be peer-marked or self-marked for example in class key tests or knowledge tests

Summative assessments = allowing teachers to measure a students' understanding against standardised criteria, these assessments will be marked and graded, you will receive formal feedback (usually mocks but also timed assessments)
